Fire Information

Smoke

The marine layer will not impact the forecast area for the next few days, allowing hotter and drier conditions to prevail. Smoke production may increase along the NE, E, and S sides of the fire. Areas in close proximity to the Dolan fire may see the worse impacts. With the weather change the SQF Complex grew yesterday, and is expected to be active today. Prevailing SSE winds may channel SQF complex smoke into the eastern portion of the forecast area. Although most of the smoke is aloft, some smoke may surface and bring USG conditions to the area.

Health

Many people may be travelling this Holiday Weekend. To minimize smoke impacts while driving, keep vehicle windows rolled up, and set the Air Conditioner or fan to the Recirculate setting.
